"But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12-13).

Can a person actually be born of God? Just what is being born of God or being "born again"? The Bible records a man, named Nicodemus, asking Jesus a question about being born again. "*How can a man be born when he is old?*" (John 3:4), he asked. Nicodemus was by no standard an ignorant man. On the contrary, he was a ruler of the Jews and, in such a position, was obviously both intelligent and educated. Yet, Nicodemus did not understand when Jesus told him, "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

The same question asked by Nicodemus is being asked by many sincere, seeking people today. Sadly, few have taken the time to search the scriptures for an explanation of the spiritual birth. And, those who try to explain this miraculous event are often influenced by erroneous church tradition or public opinion, rather than Bible truth. Let us consider this extremely important Bible subject: **born of God**.

In any study, the pursuit of truth should be paramount, but we must agree that truth is established by God, not by man. In this particular study we will consider Biblical truths relative to the outward, physical body and the inward, spiritual body of man (mankind). Man is both a physical and a spiritual being.

cs Chapter 1 &

MAN (MANKIND) HAS BOTH A PHYSICAL BODY AND A SPIRITUAL SOUL

Bible <u>Study:</u>

THE PHYSICAL BODY IS TEMPORAL AND WILL PERISH!

Bible Study:

WE MUST CONSIDER THE FUTURE OF OUR ETERNAL SOUL!

Introduction:

Strangely, most people prepare for the future of the physical body and ignore the existence of God and the future of their eternal soul. Such a person is extremely foolish.

Psalm 14:1, "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God."

Mankind makes great plans throughout life and strives to enhance his lifestyle: recreation, appearance, education, health, job, finances, and retirement. Much effort is put into caring for a body that is here today and tomorrow returns to dust. Yet, there is little thought about where the soul will spend eternity. In view of the following verses, it seems logical to prepare to meet the Almighty God and Creator of the universe.

Bible Study:

- Deuteronomy 32:29, "O that they were wise, that they understood this, that they would consider their latter end?"
- Ecclesiastes 11:8, "But if a man live many years, and rejoice in them all; yet *let him remember the days of darkness;* for they shall be many..."
- Jeremiah 29:13, "And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart."
- Amos 4:12b, "and because I will do this unto thee, prepare to meet thy God, O Israel."
- John 3:3b, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

John 3:18, "He that believeth on him is not condemned: but **he that believeth not is condemned already**, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

- Acts 16:31, "...Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house."
- Romans 14:11-12, "...As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God."

2 Peter 3:7, "But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men."

Conclusion:

There are questions we all need to ask ourselves: Where will my soul spend eternity? Is my heart right with God? Am I ready to stand before God and be judged for my sin? One must consider the aging and deterioration of the flesh and brevity of life. We will all stand before God much sooner than we think. Jesus gave simple instructions for the inward man to meet God. Jesus said, "Ye must be born again" (John 3:7b).

TWO PERSONS, TWO BIRTHS, AND TWO KINGDOMS!

Introduction:

To understand the term, "**born of God**," we must make a distinction between that which is physical and that which is spiritual. Jesus makes a distinction between the physical and spiritual person (body and soul), the physical and spiritual births (born and born again), and the physical and spiritual kingdoms (kingdom of this world and kingdom of God). Our study takes us back to Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews, apparently coming to Jesus for information (John 3:1-8). Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus was a teacher come from God and this was probably due to the miracles Jesus had performed.

Bible Study:

John 3:3, "Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." -- Please

note the word "again." When Jesus said, "born again," the word "again" implies a previous birth.

John 3:4, "Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?"

-- Nicodemus did not comprehend the spiritual truth explained by Jesus. He thought of the physical birth and knew it was not possible to be physically born a second time. It is obvious Nicodemus could not make a distinction between physical and spiritual and, therefore, he could not understand.

John 3:5, "Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God."

The focal point of this verse is, "Except a man be **born of water** and **of the Spirit**..." Some Bible scholars believe that the "water" of John 3:5 depicts the Holy Spirit or the water of the Word. Other scholars believe Jesus continued to parallel the fleshly birth with the spiritual birth to enable Nicodemus to more easily understand the truth of being born again. Inasmuch as Jesus used the fleshly birth to explain the spiritual birth, I believe the interpretation of "born of water" is more contextually correct as the water of the physical birth. Fundamental Bible scholars agree that contextual continuity totally excludes baptism from being a possible interpretation for water in John 3:5. This water illustrates birth, not death, while *baptism symbolizes a death, burial and resurrection, not birth:*

"...baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:3)

"Buried with him in baptism..." (Colossians 2:12)

Water baptism is a physical act (work) and does not save, but is a picture of the Gospel of Jesus Christ: His death, His burial and His resurrection (1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

The author believes the water in John 3:5 means the water of the womb; it substantiates the thought of two births. Mothers remember that event in the

physical birth of their children: **the water breaks**! Water brings forth or ushers a baby into the kingdom of this world (physical birth) and beautifully illustrates the Holy Spirit bringing forth or ushering the believer into the kingdom of God (spiritual birth).

John 3:6, "That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." -- Again, Jesus differentiates between the physical and

spiritual births. If one is born of fleshly parents, that person would necessarily be flesh. Also, that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Seed reproduces after its own kind. Our first birth is from the seed of our earthly father (fleshly and corruptible). The second birth is from the seed of our heavenly Father (spiritual and incorruptible). Both John 3:6 and 1 Peter 1:23 show the first (physical) birth of the flesh and the second (spiritual) birth of God.

1 Peter 1:23, "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

Let us use columns to clarify:

<u>Born</u>	<u>Born Again</u>
Born of corruptible seed	Born of incorruptible seed
Born of flesh	Born of God
Born physically	Born spiritually

John 3:7, "*Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.*" Our Lord uses "again," referring to the second birth.

John 3:8, "The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but canst not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is everyone that is born of the Spirit." "Born of the Spirit" indicates the Holy Spirit or "**born of God**."

We can see the teaching of Jesus to Nicodemus (John 3:1-8) by continuing the use of columns as follows:

The Natural	The Spiritual
Kingdom of this world	Kingdom of God
Fleshly birth	Spiritual birth
First birth	Second birth
Born (implied) - verse 3	Born again
Born of water - verse 5	Born of the Spirit (God)
Born of flesh - verse 6	Born of the Spirit (God)
Born (implied) - verse 7	Born again

The emphasis of being born of God (the second birth) is also very plain in the following verses:

John 1:12-13, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."
We can, according to God's Word, become sons of God. However, this is a spiritual relationship of the spiritual man. This relationship is gained through faith in Jesus Christ and is not earned. One does not become a member of God's family through religious acts, good deeds or works, finances, baptism, church membership, or any thing "physical." The new birth is spiritual. We are born of God (have a new beginning) when we repent, turn from our unbelief and by faith receive Jesus Christ as Saviour.

Let us use columns for John 1:13, showing the body and the soul.

The Natural Body	<u>The Spiritual Body</u>
(born fleshly)	(born spiritually)
Born of blood - verse 13	Born, not of blood
Born of the will of the flesh	Born, not of the will of the flesh
Born of the will of man	Born, not of the will of man
Born of flesh	Born of God

The Bible makes a very plain distinction between those whose only beginning (birth) is of earthly parents, and those who also have a beginning (birth) of God. Only the inward, spiritual man can be born of God and secure eternal life with God.

Conclusion:

God's Word clearly teaches the necessity of being "**born of God**." If one does not have the **second birth** (born of God), the **second person** (the soul) will not see or enter into the **second kingdom** (Kingdom of God).

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE BORN OF GOD?

d Introduction:

Birth generally means to be brought forth, to emerge into being, or to be transformed. A simple and often used definition is: **The beginning**. This refers to the beginning of life, independent of the mother's womb, traditionally referred to as our birthday.

Bible Study:

Jesus told Nicodemus: "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3b).

Jesus simply explained that, to see the kingdom of God, Nicodemus must be brought forth into the spiritual world, as he was once brought forth into the physical world. We could say one must have a physical transformation to become a member of an earthly family and one must have a spiritual transformation to become a member of the family of God.

Conclusion:

"Being *born again*" is one's new beginning, or new life in Jesus Christ, which takes place when we, believing Jesus Christ is the Son of God, repent of our sins and receive him as Lord and Saviour. The new beginning is being **born of God!**

ය Chapter 7 හ

THE POWER TO BECOME A CHILD OF GOD COMES FROM GOD!

Introduction:

John 1:12, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:" Man cannot obtain salvation through his own power, ability or wealth, but he can receive it as a gift. Some people believe they merit being a child of God because of their own goodness, righteousness or religious affiliations. Such persons look to their own intellectual and physical abilities, not realizing salvation was provided by Christ as a gift.

Romans 10:3, "For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God."

Bible Study:

Three reasons why only God can provide our salvation:

^① <u>The outward man can do nothing</u> to bring about a new life for the inward man. Flesh is subject to a carnal nature.

- Romans 7:18a, "For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing:"
- Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;"
- Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."
- Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that **not of** yourselves: it is the gift of God: **not of works**, lest any man should boast."
- ² The physical man cannot understand spiritual matters.
- 1 Corinthians 2:14, "But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." Isn't it interesting how some of the brightest minds of the world cannot grasp spiritual truths? Nicodemus could not understand and he was a ruler. Today, many do not understand.
- Mark 10:15, "Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein." Man's ego often prevents child-like faith.
- Ephesians 4:17-19, "...walk not as other Gentiles walk, in the vanity of their mind, having the understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God through the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart: Who being past feeling have given themselves over unto lasciviousness, to work all uncleanness with greediness."
- 2 Timothy 2:7, "Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things."

③ <u>Salvation is offered ONLY as a gift</u>. We cannot earn it or buy it. We can receive this gift by faith.

- John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that **he gave his only begotten Son**, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
- John 4:10, "Jesus...said unto her, **If thou knewest the gift of God**, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and **he would have given thee living water**."
- Romans 6:23b, "...but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

2 Corinthians 9:15, "Thanks be unto God for his unspeakable gift."

Ephesians 2:8, "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God."

Conclusion:

Salvation is to be received on God's terms and not our terms. Salvation is not something we achieve, but that which Jesus Christ freely gives to believers. By faith we can receive Jesus Christ, accept God's gift of eternal salvation and become the children of God. John 1:12, "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name."

ය Chapter 8 හ

ONE WHO IS BORN OF GOD HAS ASSURANCE OF ETERNAL SALVATION

Introduction:

Most people have religion for the flesh, but few have salvation for the soul. It is useless to seek assurance of salvation, if one does not truly possess salvation. There is no salvation in good works, religion, or churches; only faith in Jesus Christ results in salvation and gives full assurance.

Bible Study:

- John 3:14-16, "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
- John 3:36, "*He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life*: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him."

Everlasting is eternal and forever! This is the promise of God, who cannot lie. Eternal life is life that cannot end. Any life that ends is not (and never was) everlasting life. **There is no record in the Bible of anyone ever being saved twice**. We receive God's gift of everlasting life one time and it is *everlasting*.

- Ephesians 4:30, "*And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are <u>sealed</u> <i>unto the day of redemption.*" This word, "seal," means to establish or to settle with finality. We are His.
- 2 Timothy 1:12b, "For I know whom 1 have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to <u>keep</u> that which 1 have committed unto him against that day." God is absolutely able to "keep" an eternal soul.
- Romans 8:31, "What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?"
- Romans 8:35a, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?"
- Romans 8:38-39, "For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
- Romans 10:9, "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be <u>saved</u>."
- John 10:27-29, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: And I give unto them eternal life; and they <u>shall never perish</u>, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all: and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand."
- Hebrews 10:14, "For by one offering he hath <u>perfected</u> for ever them that are sanctified."

- 2 Timothy 4:18, "And the Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will <u>preserve</u> me unto his heavenly kingdom: to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen."
- 1 Peter 1:3-5, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath <u>begotten</u> us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, **To an inheritance** incorruptible, and undefiled, and that <u>fadeth not away</u>, reserved in heaven for you, Who are <u>kept</u> by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time."

As believers, we are:

- ☑ <u>saved</u>,
- ☑ <u>sealed</u>,
- \square preserved,
- \square perfected, and
- ☑ <u>kept</u>

by the power of Almighty God, and Jesus Christ is praying for those who are His. We also have complete assurance of eternal salvation, knowing the Creator of the universe (John 1:3) intercedes for us. He prays to the Father and they are one (John 10:30).

- John 17:9, "*I pray for them*: *I pray not for the world. but for them which thou hast given me; for they are thine.*"
- Hebrews 7:25, "Wherefore he is able also to <u>save</u> them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them."

To have complete assurance of salvation, we must understand and focus on the need. Jesus Christ came to save the **soul** of man, not his body. Paul said in 2 Timothy 2:7, "*Consider what I say; and the Lord give thee understanding in all things.*"

Conclusion:

If we believe God and the Bible to be true, we must also believe the soul that is "born of God" is **saved**, **sealed**, **preserved**, **perfected**, **and eternally kept by God**. To the believer, this is assurance of eternal salvation.

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THOSE WHO ARE BORN OF GOD ARE SAVED FOREVER!

Bible Study:

Romans 4:8, "Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not impute sin."

- 1 John 3:6, "Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him."
- 1 John 3:9, "Whosoever is <u>born of God</u> doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God."
- 1 John 5:4-5, "For whatsoever is <u>born of God</u> overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?"
- 1 John 5:18, "We know that whosoever is <u>born of God</u> sinneth not: but he that is begotten of God keepeth himself, and that wicked one toucheth him not."

The key to the above scriptures is: "whosoever is born of God." Due to confusion and failure to understand the Word of God, many Bible teachers and Bible schools teach the meaning of "doth not commit sin" as: "doth not continue to practice sin." The error in this teaching is: "practice" refers to the physical body and the above scriptures refer to the spiritual body. Again, we see a common failure in the inability to make a distinction between the physical and the spiritual.

Does "whosoever is born of God" refer to the physical (outward) man or the spiritual (inward) man? Is the outward body born of God? No! The flesh is not of the seed of God, neither is the outward man born or begotten of God. The flesh is born of corruptible seed, has a sinful nature, sinful desires and lusts, and wars against the spirit. The above verses do not imply sinlessness of the outward, physical person. The natural, carnal nature of the flesh (the outward man) will always be prone to sin as long as there is life in the flesh. Simply, "whosoever is born of God" is the inward, spiritual soul.

1 John 5:1a, "*Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God*." It is the inward man that believes or does not believe. Unbelief (sin of the inward man) is the only sin that brings eternal condemnation to the soul. Sins of the flesh bring corruption and physical death (Galatians 6:8, Hebrews 9:27).

John 3:18, "He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, **because he hath not believed** in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

Conclusion:

"Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin."

Only the inward, spiritual soul of man is born of God and that inward one who is born of God does not and cannot commit sin. The sin that damns the soul is **unbelief!** Faith wipes out unbelief and the soul is free. If one is born of God, and cannot sin, that soul is saved forever and can never be lost or

be condemned to hell. Hebrews 10:14, "For by one offering he hath **perfected** *for ever* them that are sanctified."

BEING BORN OF GOD RESULTS IN AN IMMEDIATE, INWARD CHANGE

d Introduction:

A literal and instantaneous change takes place in the inward (spiritual) person when one receives Christ. However, along with this inward change comes a battle between the old carnal nature and the new spiritual nature.

Bible Study:

- 2 Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."
- Galatians 6:15, "For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision, but a new creature."
- Romans 7:23, "But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind,..."
- Romans 8:7-9, "Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be. So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God. But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his."
- 1 Peter 2:11, "Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul."

Conclusion:

The "new creature" is the inward person who has had a change of mind, attitude and spiritual nature. As a result of this change, the new, spiritual nature and the old, carnal nature struggle for control of the flesh. As we grow closer to Christ and stronger in our faith, we become more able to overcome and control the carnal nature and the behavior of the flesh.

SECURITY OF THE SOUL IS NOT A LICENSE FOR THE FLESH TO SIN

Introduction:

Some sincere Christians insist the doctrine of eternal security is a license to live like the devil and still go to heaven. Again, confusion over the flesh (outward man) and the soul (inward man) results in error. Romans 6:1-2, "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?"

Bible Study:

Romans 7:22-25, "For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: But I see another law **in my members**, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is **in my members**. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin."

Romans 8:1, "*There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus*, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit."

1 Peter 2:11b, "...abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul."

Conclusion:

The inward person who has been born of God is a new creature, and **does not desire** to fulfill the lusts of the flesh, but strives to suppress and control fleshly desires and lusts, and is grieved when the flesh prevails. *The individual whose spiritual nature desires to satisfy the sins of the flesh, does not have a new nature and has never been born of God*!

SINS OF THE FLESHLY BODY AND THE SIN OF THE SOUL

Introduction:

One may ask, "are there different sins of the fleshly body and the spiritual body?" Yes, emphatically yes! Although we have churches teaching that salvation requires sinless perfection of the physical body, such is neither possible, nor scriptural. The Christian's walk is seen in the outward man, or life, but the fleshly or outward man is always in conflict with the inward man. The Christian, after putting his trust in Jesus Christ, becomes a new spiritual creature, with a new **inward** nature. As Christians mature, they will strive to bring the carnal nature under control and subjection. The Bible deals with both the physical body and the spiritual body, but many, either willfully or ignorantly, seem unable to comprehend the spiritual. It is "natural" for all of us to focus on the physical and it is "spiritual" for those born of God to focus on the spiritual. The following scriptures show a distinct difference.

Bible Study:

① <u>The scriptures say we all sin!</u>

- Romans 3:9-10, "What then? are we better than they? No, in no wise: for we have before proved both Jews and Gentiles, that they are all under sin; As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one:"
- Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God."
- 1 John 1:8-10, "*If we say that we have no sin*, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. *If we confess our sins*, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. *If we say that we have not sinned*, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."
- ^② The scriptures say those born of God cannot sin!
- 1 John 3:6, "*Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not*: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him."
- 1 John 3:9, "...Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God."
- 1 John 5:4a, "For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world:"
- John 5:18, "We know that whosoever is born of God sinneth not; but he that is begotten of God keepeth himself, and that wicked one toucheth him not."

Conclusion:

① and ②, above, would be a contradiction of the Word of God, if the Apostle John was not making a distinction between the natural man and the spiritual man.

SATAN ATTACKS US THROUGH THE FLESH

Introduction:

According to 1 John 2:16, all sins of the flesh can be broken down to three categories: 1. *lust of the flesh*; 2. *lust of the eyes*; 3. *pride of life*.

Bible Study:

Let us consider Eve in the Garden of Eden. Eve became guilty of all three categories when she decided to eat of the forbidden fruit (Gen. 3:6):

- 1. The fruit was good for food (lust of the flesh).
- 2. It was pleasant to the eyes (lust of the eyes).
- 3. It was desired to make one wise (the pride of life).

Eve was guilty of these fleshly sins, but before she succumbed to fleshly temptations, Eve was guilty of a greater, inward, spiritual sin. The first sin of Eve was in her innermost being: Eve did not believe and put her trust in God and His Word!

The three categories, in the above paragraph, cover the sins of all flesh, including David (2 Samuel 11:2-6) and Samson (Judges 14:1-12). We see in Matthew 4:1-10 where Satan also tried to tempt our Lord in the same three areas above. Satan appealed to Jesus to:

- 1. Satisfy the **flesh** by commanding stones to be made bread, v. 3.
- 2. Satisfy the eyes by seeing the kingdoms of the world, v. 8.
- 3. Satisfy the **pride of life** by proving He was the Son of God, v. 6.

Conclusion:

Our Saviour was victorious over the flesh. He was perfect and sinless as both man and God. Galatians 5:24, "And they that are Christ's have crucified the *flesh with the affections and lusts.*" Christians must crucify and control the flesh if they are to be victorious in this world.

ের Chapter 14 ২০ YOUR FLESH WILL NOT DETERMINE THE DESTINY OF YOUR SOUL

Introduction:

Some believe good people go to heaven, and bad people go to hell. <u>This is not</u> <u>true</u>! If only good people went to heaven, none of us would be there because, *"there is none that doeth good, no, not one."* (Romans 3:12b). If only bad people went to hell, we would all be there because, *"For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God."* (Romans 3:23). Let us consider some who went to hell, one who went to heaven, and the difference.

Bible Study:

The rich man: Luke 16:22-23, "...*the rich man also died, and was buried; and in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments...*" The Bible gives no record of this man doing anything evil, although all men are sinners. The rich man did, however, ask Father Abraham to send Lazarus to testify to his brothers, "lest they also come into this place of torment" (v. 28c). Abraham said, "*If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead*" (v. 31). It is obvious the rich man did not believe in God while on the earth, but he became a believer in hell. He believed, but too late!

The Pharisee: Luke 18:11-14 relates the life of the Pharisee. He testified that **he was not** an extortioner, unjust, or an adulterer, but fasted twice a week, gave tithes of all his possessions, and was obviously a religious leader. He depended upon his own apparent goodness rather than on Jesus Christ. Jesus plainly said the Pharisee was not justified.

King Agrippa: When the Apostle Paul was speaking to King Agrippa, he said, "*King Agrippa, believest thou the prophets? I know that thou believest. Then Agrippa said unto Paul, Almost thou persuadest me to be a Christian*" (Acts 26:27-28). King Agrippa was in charge of the temple at Jerusalem and was the one who designated the High Priest. The Bible gives no record of King Agrippa being wicked, but he apparently died without Christ.

The thief on the cross: Remember the thief on the cross with Christ? He confessed he was condemned justly and deserved the death penalty. We have no record of this thief ever doing one good deed, joining a church, giving a tithe, or being baptized. This man was not good, but he believed in Jesus. This is indicated by: confession of sin, acknowledging Jesus as Lord, and his request to Jesus. Jesus said to this wicked man, "*To day shalt thou be with me in paradise*" (Luke 23:43b).

Conclusion:

- ☑ No sins of the flesh ever sent a soul to eternal punishment.
- ☑ No goodness of the flesh ever admitted one soul into heaven.
- ☑ The sin that damns souls for all eternity is UNBELIEF.
- ☑ Eternal salvation of the soul is God's gift to BELIEVERS.
- ☑ BELIEF and UNBELIEF are actions of the inward man, not the flesh, and the one who TRUSTS in Jesus Christ will never have reason to DISTRUST. The inward person (soul), who is born of God, cannot disbelieve (sin) and that soul can never be lost.

WE CAN KNOW WE ARE BORN OF GOD!

Introduction:

Multitudes **think** they are born of God because of their morality or religious lifestyle rather than trusting in Jesus. Many sincere Christians have surrendered themselves to the Lord, but are not sure if they are born of God. Limited knowledge of the Bible causes doubt. When we doubt, we should take inventory. The four following tests will help to check out one's salvation

Bible Study:

Check your fruit.

Because of the new nature, the true believer will desire to control the flesh. As new Christians mature, they gain more control of the flesh and produce fruit.

- John 15:5, "I am the vine, ye are the branches: **He that abideth in me, and I in** him, the same bringeth forth much fruit..."
- Matthew 7:15-16, "Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. Ye shall know them by their fruits..."
- Matthew 7:20, "Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them."
- Hebrews 6:8, "But that which beareth thorns and briers is rejected, and is nigh unto cursing; whose end is to be burned."

☑ <u>Check God's chastening for your carnal sin.</u>

When Christians fail to control the flesh, God deals with them as a concerned father to a disobedient child; God disciplines His own.

- Hebrews 12:6-8, "For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth. If ye endure chastening, God dealeth with you as with sons; for what son is he whom the father chasteneth not? But if ye be without chastisement, whereof all are partakers, then are ye bastards, and not sons."
- ☑ <u>Check for the presence of God's Holy Spirit in your life.</u>
- 1 Corinthians 3:16, "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?"
- Romans 8:14, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."
- Romans 8:16, "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God."

\square <u>Check the Word of God.</u>

1 John 5:13, "These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God."

- 2 Timothy 2:15, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."
- 2 Timothy 3:16-17, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works."

ය Chapter 16 හ MAKING THE CHOICE

Introduction:

Joshua 24:15b, "...choose you this day whom ye will serve ..."

The Holy Spirit of God brings each of us to a place in our life where we realize God and eternity are real; and we must then make a choice of what we will do about our relationship with God.

It is difficult to break old superstitions, religious traditions and doubt, but one can only receive Jesus Christ by faith. The greatest choice you and I will ever make in our life is an eternity with or without Jesus Christ as Saviour. It is truly a choice of eternal life or eternal death.

In studying God's Word, we find that sin produces death and all flesh will die because of carnal sin. For those who will not believe, there will also be death to the soul, which is eternal separation from God and eternal punishment in hell.

Bible Study:

 \square The following scriptures show us that sin produces death:

- Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."
- Genesis 2:17, "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die."
- Romans 5:12, "Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned:"

Ezekiel 18:4c, 20a, "The soul that sinneth, it shall die."

Revelation 20:14-15, "And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. **This** is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire."

This verse speaks of the dreadful eternity of the soul. Whether we consider physical sin which brought forth physical death to the body, or spiritual sin which brings forth spiritual death to the soul, God says: "*the wages of sin is death*."

☑ Thank God there is another choice, and that is LIFE!

- John 3:14-16, "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have **eternal life**. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but **have everlasting life**."
- John 17:3, "And this is life eternal, that they might know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent."
- Galatians 6:8, "For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap **life everlasting.**"

Conclusion:

It is our choice[.]

Life or Death: Heaven or Hell: **Jesus Christ or Satan!**

John 3:17-18, "For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already. BECAUSE HE HATH NOT BELIEVED in the name of the only begotten Son of God."

"*Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble*" (James 2:19).

To become a child of God, we must believe to the point of trust!

To truly believe is to accept Jesus as Saviour of our eternal soul, repent of our sins and submit ourselves to Him forever. We can, by faith, make the decision to accept Jesus as Lord of our life and Saviour of our eternal soul, now: "...*behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation*"

(2 Corinthians 6:2b).
